

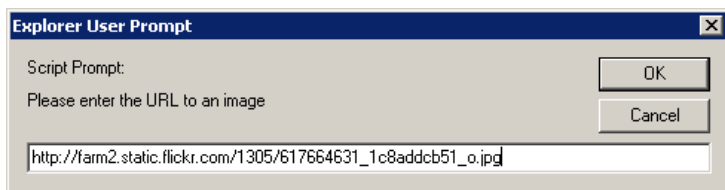
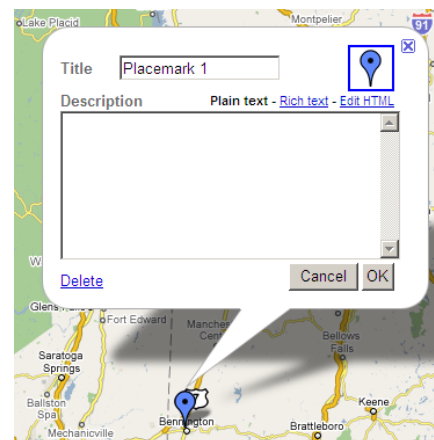
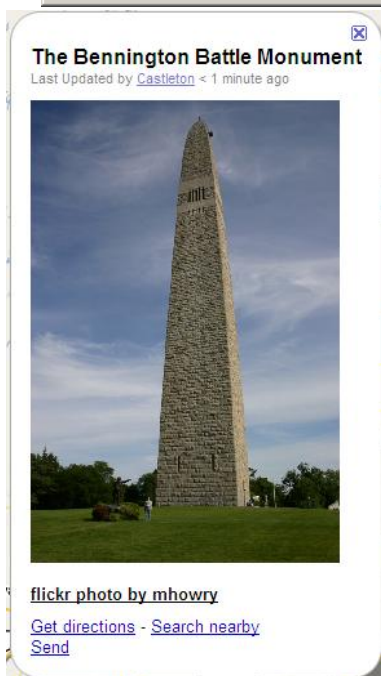


Adding an Image to a Map in Google Maps

1. Go to Google Maps - <http://maps.google.com/>
2. Log in as cscmaps09@gmail.com with the password [cscmaps09](#)
3. Click on "My Maps" and click on "Create a New Map"
4. Give your map a title
5. Zoom in on Vermont by dragging with the hand tool and double-clicking on Vermont.
6.  Move a placemark on top of Bennington.
7. Click on the placemark symbol to change it to a different placemark if you wish.
8. Give it a title and description. In this case title it the "Bennington Battle Monument." Add a little descriptive text if you like.
9. Click on the "Rich text" link and click on the "Insert image" icon. 
10. You will need to insert the URL of an online image. Copy and paste this URL into the "Script Prompt" box by right clicking in the box and choosing paste.

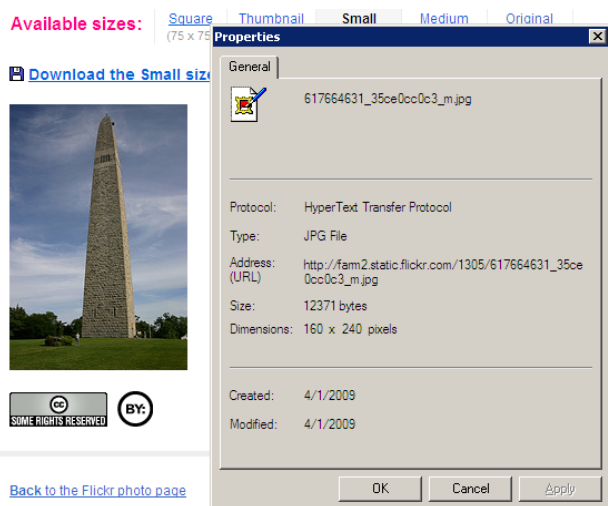
11. When you click "OK" and "OK" on the next Window and click on "Save" and "Done" on the left the Photo should be embedded into the



placemark. Click on the placemark to see if it worked.

12. To get the URL of any photo online. Right click on the photo and go to properties, highlight the URL of the photo and right click and choose "copy."

13. Copyright laws should be observed when using images in a project like this. In addition to photographs you take yourself there are millions of Creative Commons licensed photographs available on the Flickr Web site.
